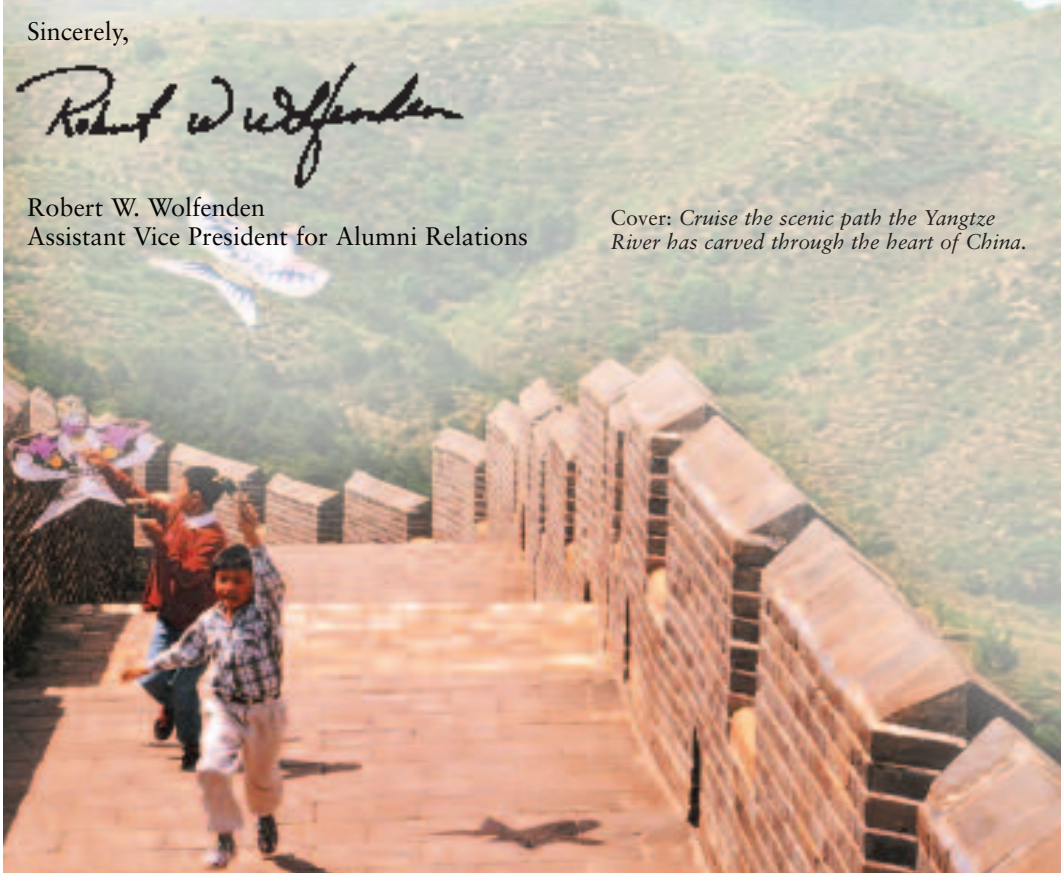

U.S./BEIJING, CHINA

*Wednesday, October 14, and
Thursday, October 15*

Depart for Beijing, the former imperial city of Mongol, Ming and Manchu emperors. Rich in historical sites and cultural relics, Beijing is a dynamic city of more than 12 million people and the cultural and spiritual heart of China. Upon arrival, meet your Travel Director and transfer to the deluxe *Regent Beijing Hotel*, which combines state-of-the-art amenities and comforts with traditional Chinese elegance and hospitality.

BEIJING

Friday, October 16

This morning, achieve physical and mental balance during a master-led session of the classic Chinese meditative martial art of Tai Chi in the hotel. Stroll through Tiananmen Square, the largest public square in the world, and see the Mao Zedong Memorial Hall, burial site of modern China's founder. Walk through the ceremonial halls, royal apartments,

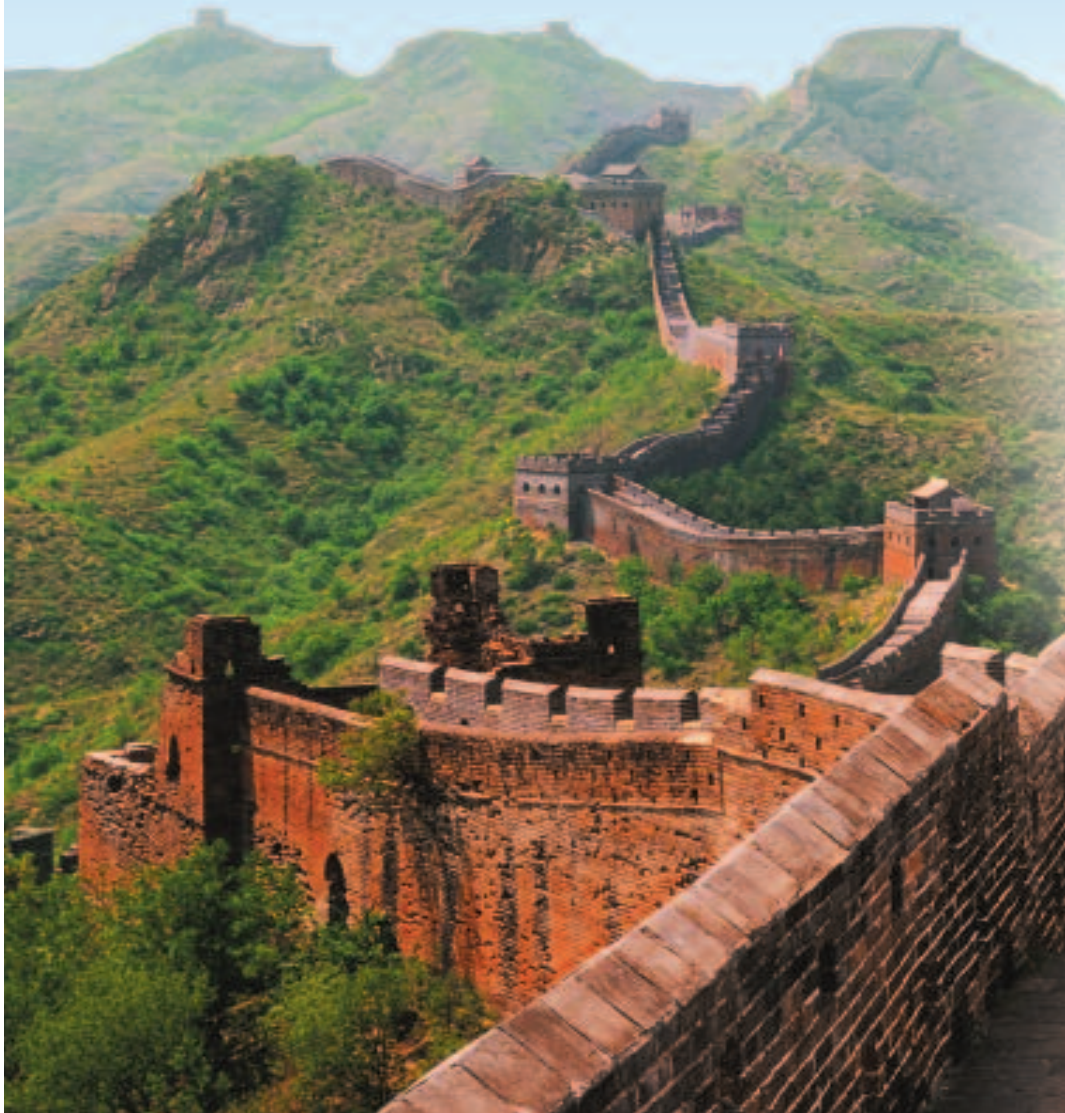

BEIJING

Saturday, October 17

Visit the magnificent Great Wall of China in Badaling. The symbol of imperial grandeur since 500 B.C., the wall was constructed over the course of 2,000 years. This imposing fortification once spanned more than 3,500 miles and served to protect China against invaders from the steppes of Central Asia. Ascend by cable car, walk along the wall and pause in the watchtowers for a sweeping view of the northern plains, valleys and villages below. Return to Beijing early this afternoon, stopping en route for lunch, to see a 2008 Summer Olympics venue and to watch a children's gymnastics class.

In the undulating mountains of northern China, walk along the Great Wall and embrace more than 2,500 years of history and the mystery and allure of the world's oldest civilization.





the Muslim Quarter into Xi'an's Great Mosque, one of China's best-preserved Muslim sanctuaries. View the distinctive triple-eaved Bell and Drum Towers, from which watchmen once signaled dawn and dusk with a bell and a drum. Visit the Yangling Imperial Tomb Museum, where thousands of captivating figurines excavated from the 2,100-year-old tomb of Emperor Liu Qi capture the essence of daily life during the Han Dynasty, a high point in Chinese history when culture and the arts flourished as never before.

Following lunch, board your flight to Chongqing. On arrival, visit a panda sanctuary before embarking the M.V. VICTORIA ANNA to begin your cruise down the fabled Yangtze River.

CRUISING THE YANGTZE RIVER

*Wednesday, October 21, and
Thursday, October 22*

Journey downstream and dock at the mystic and captivating city of Fengdu, once known as the "City of Ghosts" for its associations with Tianzi, the ancient Chinese deity of the underworld. Here, in a lush mountainous setting that evokes the dreamy landscapes of a traditional Chinese brush painting, learn more about Chinese ghost culture and discover a unique blend of Taoist, Buddhist and Confucian artistic styles, manifested in a fascinating array of sculptures, paintings and architecture.

The following morning, cruise through the Twelve Peaks of Wu Gorge en route to Wushan. Aboard excursion boats, travel up the Daning River through the majestic scenery of the Three Small Gorges and watch for golden monkeys on the riverbank.

Visit Beijing's Summer Palace to admire a perfect example of classical Chinese architecture blending in harmony with its splendid natural setting.

BEIJING/XI'AN

Sunday, October 18

Explore the beautifully landscaped grounds of the Summer Palace, a retreat of the 19th-century Empress Dowager Cixi. Walk through apartments featuring jewel-encrusted furniture and precious objects. See Cixi's ornate Marble Boat, embellished with stained glass, then cruise by private boat across Kunming Lake's tranquil waters. This afternoon, fly from Beijing to Xi'an, China's capital for 11 dynasties. On arrival, check into the newly opened, deluxe *Sofitel on Renmin Square*, ideally located near the city's most historic landmarks.

XI'AN

Monday, October 19

A local expert introduces you to an amazing 20th-century archaeological find: the famous terra cotta warriors. These life-size figures—no two alike—have guarded the still-unopened tomb of China's first emperor, Qin Shihuang, for more than 2,000 years. After lunch on your own, tour the Shaanxi Provincial History Museum and admire its Forest of Stelae, a collection of more than 1,000 stone tablets inscribed with historical and religious texts. Continue to Small Wild Goose Pagoda, a graceful Tang Dynasty shrine built in A.D. 707.

Tonight, enjoy a dinner of regional dumplings in a restaurant specializing in this cuisine.

XI'AN/CHONGQING/CRUISE

Tuesday, October 20

This morning, stroll along the winding lanes and past the bustling food stalls of





Stroll along Shanghai's famous Bund on the banks of the Huangpu River, where elegant 19th-century architecture stands as a symbol of the city's legacy as a cosmopolitan center of culture and commerce.

Enjoy a private cocktail reception this evening as you pass through the Qutang Gorge.

THREE GORGES DAM/ YICHANG/SHANGHAI

Friday, October 23

Visit the impressive Three Gorges Dam construction site. Considered a key to China's modernization, it is the world's largest hydroelectric dam and will create the world's largest reservoir. After lunch, disembark and transfer to Yichang's airport for your flight to Shanghai. On arrival, proceed to the deluxe *Longement Shanghai Hotel*.

Dinner is on your own and the evening is at leisure.

Watch for traditional craft, such as this sampan, which still ply the Yangtze River's tranquil waters.



SHANGHAI

Saturday, October 24

Stroll through the historic French Concession to admire the quarter's distinctive European-influenced architecture. View the residences of Sun Yat-Sen and Zhou Enlai, two of 20th-century China's most famous leaders, and visit the Shanghai Arts and Crafts Center. Walk along the famous Bund, past elegant neoclassical buildings lining the Huangpu River. En route to Three on the Bund, pass by the landmark Peace Hotel, a stately post-Renaissance structure built in 1916. This afternoon, get an inside look at life in China during visits to an elementary school and a hospital.

This evening, the option is available to see the world-renowned Shanghai acrobats perform.

SHANGHAI

Sunday, October 25

Begin your day with a guided tour of the famous Shanghai Museum, home of the finest and most complete exhibit of Chinese *objets d'art* in the country. This afternoon, explore the tranquil Yuyuan Garden and walk the narrow streets and back alleys of Shanghai's old Chinese Quarter, where traditional shops and restaurants bustle with visitors.

Join fellow participants this evening for the private farewell reception in the hotel.

Monday, October 26

Depart from Shanghai this morning. Cross the International Date Line and arrive in the U.S. later today.

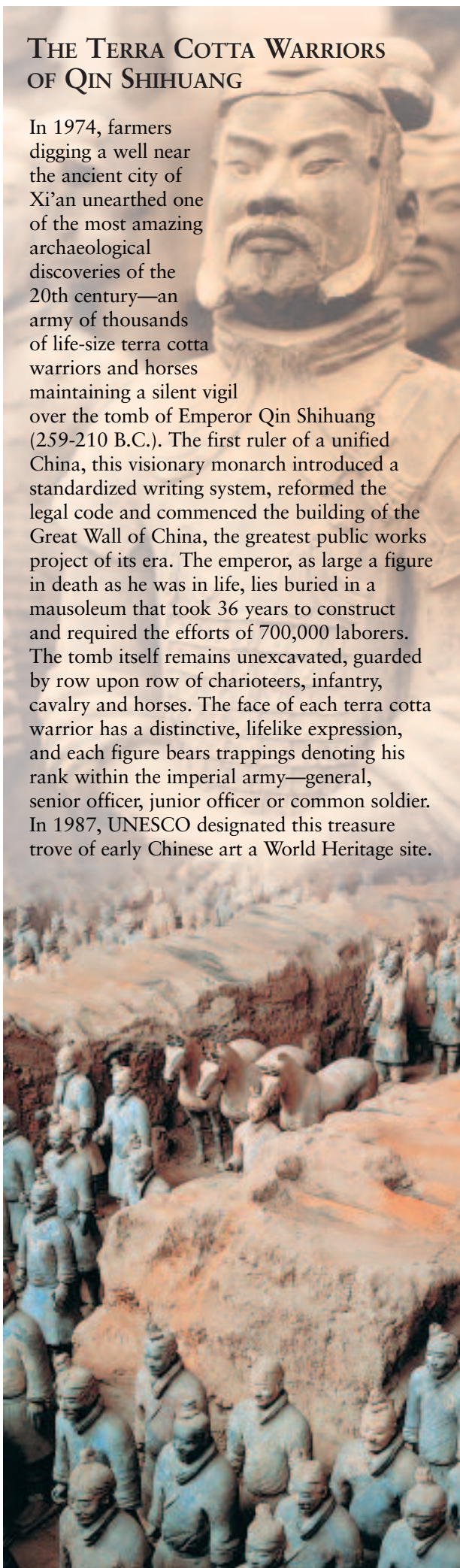
Explore the picturesque old city of Guilin, a traditional Chinese community dating from the Ming Dynasty (1368-1644), and the bustling metropolis of Hong Kong on this four-night extension designed to highlight the fascinating contrasts of a land in transition from the old to the new. Complete information will be provided with your reservation confirmation.

See the same ethereal limestone pinnacles, cloaked in a mantle of green and rising majestically above the Li River near Guilin, that have inspired Chinese painters and artists for more than 2,000 years.



THE TERRA COTTA WARRIORS OF QIN SHIHUANG

In 1974, farmers digging a well near the ancient city of Xi'an unearthed one of the most amazing archaeological discoveries of the 20th century—an army of thousands of life-size terra cotta warriors and horses maintaining a silent vigil over the tomb of Emperor Qin Shihuang (259-210 B.C.). The first ruler of a unified China, this visionary monarch introduced a standardized writing system, reformed the legal code and commenced the building of the Great Wall of China, the greatest public works project of its era. The emperor, as large a figure in death as he was in life, lies buried in a mausoleum that took 36 years to construct and required the efforts of 700,000 laborers. The tomb itself remains unexcavated, guarded by row upon row of charioteers, infantry, cavalry and horses. The face of each terra cotta warrior has a distinctive, lifelike expression, and each figure bears trappings denoting his rank within the imperial army—general, senior officer, junior officer or common soldier. In 1987, UNESCO designated this treasure trove of early Chinese art a World Heritage site.

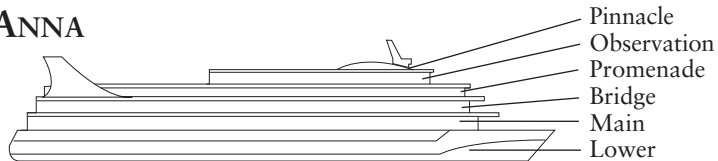

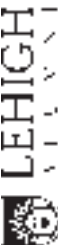
